We are often quietly brave.

We also have a great time at Sibshops offered by WisconSibs, Inc. We meet other kids who share many of the same feelings we do. We talk about our challenges and hear how other kids deal with things. We play. We get information. We brag about our siblings. We make friends.

What are Sibshops?

Sibshops are celebrations of the many contributions made by sisters and brothers of kids with special health or developmental needs.

These workshops for "typical" siblings combine recreation, information and discussion. Kids age 6-12 attending WisconSibs Sibshops enjoy a lively, relaxed event that emphasizes a kid's eye view of sibling issues.



Sibshops are guided by facilitators in small, age-appropriate groups. Sibshop facilitators include school psychologists, teachers, counselors, and adult siblings. All are trained in sibling issues and always keep an eye open for participants who may need additional support.

Most WisconSibs Sibshops are 2-4 hours long, usually on a Saturday. Sibshops are held monthly, September through April. Each has a small participant fee.*
